Eagerly seek the greater gifts. And now, I am going to show you a more excellent way. (1 Corinthians 12:31EHV)

LOVE: THE GREATEST GIFT

We use the word for ice cream and pets and spouse and sports teams. We use it for weather and movies and friends and places. In some ways, it's a topic too big to tackle, yet here we go. Paul had many issues to address among the Corinthian Christians, but before he could get into how we seek the greater gifts, he first went to the heart of it by going to love itself.

In the closing verses of the previous chapter, Paul presented love as "a more excellent way" to dig into the topic of spiritual gifts. Love motivates the use of those spiritual gifts, but that leads directly to the heart of the problem: Is my heart really loving? When I take some time for self-reflection and an honest look inside myself, I don't always see love. Or rather, I see a kind of love that is too often misdirected. My love is focused on myself. All my favorite franchises, flavors, and friendships depend on how they benefit me or align with what I like. So even if I were to act in that love, it is self-serving at its root.

That is why, when Paul encouraged us to seek, he also said, "I am going to show you." See, we're not going to come to these conclusions on our own. Love isn't a result of deeply looking into ourselves, but it has to come from outside of us, outside of our personal preferences, and outside of our world. And love did just that.


As we walk through this brief chapter, every time that the word *love* appears, you can read Jesus to see the perfect love that fulfills and replaces all our weak attempts to love. Jesus' love is not only the most excellent way but the exclusive way and truth and life. Without the love of Christ, there would be no such thing as love, and even our feeble attempts to copy his love would come to nothing. Yet through his life, death, and resurrection, our love is enabled and renewed. He loved you to the point of pouring out his life in your stead. This now allows you to see others ad he does: dear souls in need of his love—love that Jesus freely gave.

Lord of love, we often take a shallow approach to love in our lives, Let our love first see you and the love you have given us in Jesus. May your love transform our love and our lives. In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen

Book choice: "Death Stalks Door County" by Patricia Skalka

About the author: Patricia Skalka is a former writer for *Reader's Digest*. She presents writing workshops throughout the United States. She divides her time between her native Chicago and her cottage in Door County, Wisconsin.

<u>About the book</u>: Six deaths mar the holiday mood as summer vacationers enjoy Wisconsin's beautiful Door County peninsula. Murders or bizarre accidents? Newly hired park ranger Dave Cubiak, a former Chicago homicide detective, assumes the worst but refuses to get involved. Griefstricken and guilt-ridden over the loss of his wife and daughter, he's had enough of death. Forced to confront the past, the morose Cubiak moves beyond his own heartache and starts investigating, even as a popular festival draws more people into possible danger. In a desperate search for clues Cubiak uncovers a tangled web of greed, betrayal, bitter rivalries, and lost love beneath the peninsula's travel-brochure veneer. Befriended by several locals but unsure whom to trust or to suspect of murder, the onetime cop tracks a clever killer.

Mayor Victoria Dobbs Overstreet is a Harvard-trained attorney and Spelman alum, married to a celebrated heart surgeon, mother of beautiful twin girls, and a political genius. When her mentor, ally, and friend Congresswoman Ezra Hawkins is gunned down in Ebenezer Baptist Church, Victoria finds a "paper god"-tucked inside his Bible. These paper gods turn up again and again always after someone is kicked. Someone is terrorizing those who are close to Mayor Dobbs, and she can't shake the feeling that the killer is close to her, too.
