PRELUDE AND RINGING OF THE BELL WELCOME AND STEWARDSHIP OPPORTUNITIES ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING *

- L The season of Advent continues. Four thousand years of waiting for the Messiah, commemorated by the lighting of four candles.
- P We join with a hopeful throng in the lighting of the Advent candles, symbols of our faith and signs of God's love.
- L We are a people of hope. Last Sunday the frail light of a single candle dared to pierce through the darkness of desolation and sin.
- P Hope lives in us and will abide with us.
- L Today we will light the candle of peace.
- P This light, too, must brave great darkness.
- L In an age when people so seldom find peace within themselves, and when all the earth stands under threat of total annihilation, we light a fire called peace.
- P Peace that is not merely the absence of war and conflict, but peace that is the fullness of blessing for all that is the peace for which we dare to hope.
- L The Christ comes to bring peace to those who have been separated from God and one another.
- P In the name of that Child born so long ago, we light the candle of peace. In following Christ's teachings we nurture our hope for peace even today.

⁷ Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. ⁸ For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the ancestors ⁹ and that the gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. "Therefore I will confess you among the gentiles and sing praises to your name";



Just before Jesus begins his public ministry, John the Baptist appears, calling people to mend their ways and speaking of a powerful one who is to come.

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 3rd chapter

C Glory to you, O Lord.

¹ In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ² "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³ This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord;

make his paths straight."

⁴ Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵ Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶ and they were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸ Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance, ⁹ and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰ Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ "I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."




