## THIS IS WHO YOU ARE

Who are you? You could answer that question in a number of ways. You have a name and a birthday. You are someone's child. Perhaps you are someone's husband or wife, father or mother. You could answer this question by describing your physical features, your job, your pastimes, or even your skills and abilities. All of these things make you who you are in the world.

Who are you? According to Jesus, you are salt and light. Yet that is not always what you were. In 1 Corinthians chapter 6, the apostle Paul states we were the sexually immoral, greedy, drunkards, slanderers, and the like. In short, we were lost and condemned sinners.

But then Paul continues, “That is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God” (1 Corinthians 6:11). Notice that Paul says all those terrible descriptions of you are in the past. That is what you *were*. However, now you *are* washed, sanctified, and justified in Jesus. You are no longer lost and condemned because you have been redeemed by Christ. The guilt and shame of a sinful past is replaced by a new and holy life granted to you by Jesus' victory at the cross and empty tomb. Jesus accomplished everything necessary to forgive your sins; therefore, he can rightly say that you are salt and light.

This very day, you are salt and light. This is not a command of Jesus to work on becoming salt and light in the future. This is who already are in Christ. This is who he made you to be. He made you to be the salt that preserves and flavors the world. He made you a light to reflect the light of the gospel. With God's help, may you joyfully be who you truly are: the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

**Dear God, thank you for taking me from who I was, a lost and condemned sinner, and making me who I am: a child of your grace. Amen**

The meeting was opened by Joanne Adlon at 6:00 p.m. leading the Council Prayer.

A motion was made to accept the Meeting Agenda by Gene & 2nd by George. Motion approved.

Reports from Congregation Council

Representatives:

Pastors Report: (Mary Lou Plummer)

- Pastor spent time at Bay View Lutheran Church helping them while they're without a Pastor.
- Pastor reports she has received Devotional pamphlets for Advent.

- Lighting Assessment- need to contact a lighting specialist regarding upgrade.

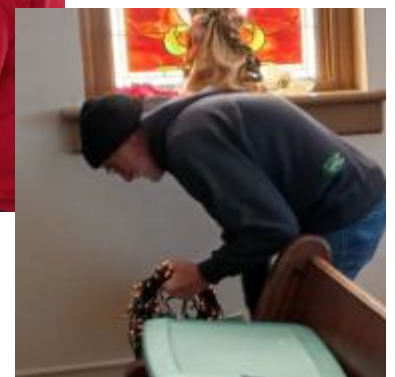
Closing Prayer & Adjourn: Motion to adjourn was made by Gene & 2nd by Sue. Motion approved.

The work is all done so now it is time to rest and visit.

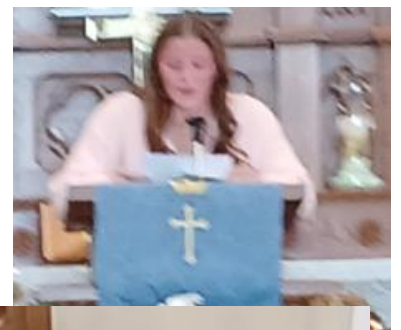


**The finished product!!!!**
