GIVING EVERYTHING

People often experience regret in their lives. Maybe it was a test that you knew you should have studied for more as a student. Maybe it was some project at work that wasn't completed as well as you would have liked. Maybe as you wanted to speak about something to a person, but you ran out of time. There are plenty of times when there were things we wanted to do, but we were unable to do them and regretted it later.

For the widow in the parable, we know she did not regret her actions. Jesus could see the hearts of those who were giving money at the temple. He knew her heart was one of faith and trust, even as she put in everything—all that she had to live on. There was no regret in her actions.

As Jesus pointed her out to his disciples, he must have been thinking about what would happen before the week was over. This event took place during Holy Week. Jesus knew that his betrayal, suffering, and death were close at hand. He knew that within days, he would give everything—his own life—to make payment for the sins of the world.

Was that something Jesus would regret doing? After all, what was in it for him? Why give his life for a bunch of sinners? Why die for everyone when so many would not believe? According to our way of thinking, that seems like something Jesus would regret.

But such is the heart of our God. His heart is filled with grace and compassion beyond our understanding. He was willing to give everything of himself, even his life, in order to give us life. Love for all people was why he came to earth and was born with human flesh and blood. Love was why he traveled to Jerusalem. And love was why he would give everything, his own, life, until every sin was paid for. There would be no regret on Jesus' part, because he loved all people.

Lord Jesus, we marvel at your great love and mercy. We praise you for giving your life for us. Amen.

The Council meeting was closed with the "Lord's Prayer" led by Joanne Adlon at 7:08 pm.


