May the Lord increase your love and make it overflow for each other and for all people, just as ours does for you...(1Thessalonians 3:12 EHV)

ASK GOD TO INCREASE YOUR LOVE FOR ALL PEOPLE

Let us look at how Paul prayed that God would increase the Thessalonian Christians' love for *all* people.

Just think about what that meant for the Thessalonian Christians. It meant showing love to those who were persecuting them! In his Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5), Jesus instructs us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us. Is it really possible to be kind and compassionate to those who hate us? YES!! After all, Paul prayed that *God* would grant this increase in love, not that the Thessalonians would somehow generate this love on their own.

It is, of course, God's will that we also show increased loved for all people—love for the coworker who snickers at our faith; love for the relative who keeps making bad choices that mess up our daily routine; for someone who has hurt us with gossip. But our sinful nature would rather have us hold a grudge than forgive. It would rather that we be standoffish than kind. Like a dog that buries a bone so that no other dog will take it, we'd rather bury our love than generously share it.

So how doo we show increased love to all people, when our enemies? By recalling what God did for us in our baptism. In Baptism, God washed us clean from the sin of not loving our enemies. Not only that, he loosened the sinful nature's control over us, just as soaking a pot in soapy water loosens the cooking grease.

Satan doesn't want us to remember the power of our baptism. He wants us to believe that our sinful nature's demands are as nonnegotiable as the demands of the gun-waving bank robber. But here's the thing: our sinful nature is brandishing a gun with no bullets because Baptism has emptied our sinful nature of its power to control us. We are not helpless victims of our sinful nature anymore. We can say "no" to our sinful nature because we are children of God and servants of Christ. He calls and empowers us to love **all** people, even our enemies.

Lord Jesus, help me always remember that I love because you loved me first. In the power of your love, help me show love to all people—even those who make my life difficult. Help me love willingly, not grudgingly. Amen
