

"What do you think? There was a man who had two sons. He went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard.' 'I will not,' he answered, but later he changed his mind and went. Then the father went to the other son and said the same thing. He answered, 'I will sir,' but he did not go." (Matthew 21:28-30 NIV)

"I DON'T WANT TO"

It doesn't take long for a child to learn the meaning of the word *no*. Parents teach their children not to touch a hot stove or to stop whining. "No. Don't touch," they'll say. Or "No. That's naughty."

It is estimated that some toddlers hear the word *no* up to four hundred times a day. It shouldn't surprise us that children soon begin to use that word themselves. "No, I don't want to go bed." "No, I don't want to pick up my toys."

Jesus told his enemies a story about someone who said no. A father asked his two sons to go and work for him in his vineyard. The first son clearly knew the meaning of the word *no*. "I will not," he said. "I don't want to." But at some point this son had a change of heart. He honored his father's request and went off to work.

That's a picture of repentance. The Greek word for *repent* means "to have a change of mind." This son had a change of mind from no to yes. He changed his mind about doing what his father wanted, and this change of mind showed in his actions.

Jesus told this story to illustrate how some people who had lived sinful lives—like the tax collectors and prostitutes of his day—had repented. They humbled themselves before the Lord and admitted their guilt. When they turned to Jesus in faith, his forgiving love changed their lives from no to yes. If only the chief priests and elders had done the same thing!

When the Lord tells us what he wants us to do, the natural reaction of our sinful nature is to say no. "I don't care what God says. I don't want to do what he wants. I want to do things my way. I'm going to do things my way. I'm going to do what I want to do."

It takes a miracle of the Holy Spirit to bring about repentance and faith. Thank God he's in the business of miracles! Rejoice in the change the Holy Spirit has made in your heart. Let the peace of forgiveness be the light of your life.

Dear Lord, teach me more and more to say yes to your will and no to the will of my sinful nature. Amen.


