Christ and one another in their marriage, it is also a time for all of us to reflect on our commitments to God, to one another, to our neighbors, and to our selves.

As children of God, all humanity is connected. Created in the image of God, we have been made to be in relationship – to live in communion with our siblings and our Creator. As a human being looking at myself

through the lens of relationship with God, I see three identities that I share in common with all people: blessed, beloved, and broken. It is only by God's grace, mercy, and unfailing love that this "works". As we will be moving from Epiphany into Lent, we find Jesus, the Light of the World, as the revelation of God at work in the world, making all things new. Recently, we heard Jesus say in Matthew 4:17, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven as come near." To repent, is to be made new - a new way of being, a total reorientation and a radical transformation in how we see, think, and respond to the world, seeing all people as they are: blessed, beloved, and broken.

Jesus has drawn near to us, to live among us, to show us the way to be in the world as the reign of God moves closer to fulfillment. Jesus is the promise God made to us, the promise, which we are to take seriously, the promise, which we are called to trust. This "works" when we stop

In my own life, I am finding this to be true. True happiness is found outside the walls of selfcenteredness. As we will be hearing from Matthew again very soon in our Gospel reading, Jesus' leads off his Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes. Jesus shares a vision that is radically different than the way the world sees, reminding us that come what may, in our brokenness we are

In <u>Life of the Beloved</u>, Henri Nouwen is on to something as he writes, "As the Beloved ones, our greatest fulfillment lies in becoming bread for the world. That is the most intimate expression of our deepest desire to give ourselves to each other.... Our real gift is not so much of what we can do, but who we are. The real question is not "What can we offer each

other?" but "Who can we be for each other?" Richard and Tillie Hannemann have learned the answer to this question in 70 years of marriage. Yet, the question is not reserved for marriage. It is a central question for all relationships, placing Christ at the center, holding true with parents and children, brothers and sisters, friends, and neighbors. For all of us, it even goes beyond that. In Christ, who journeys to the cross to give himself in love, we are called to turn the world's expectations upside down, asking the question, "Who can we be for our enemies?" The love of Jesus knows no boundaries.


Bold Women of the ELCA



Week of Lent 1: Change of Season

"For everything there is a season." We hear those familiar words telling us that life is full of changes. Jesus' parables are also filled with images of life transformed. Just as the mustard seed grows into a tree or yeast turns flour into read, we too are called to be agents of change in the kingdom of God. Christ did not come to earth to maintain the status quo, but rather to usher in a change of season.

Week of Lent 2: Change of Habit Bad habits are hard to break. The letter to the Galatians urges us to replace them with the fruits of the Spirit. Love, patience, generosity, and self-control are just some of the good habits practiced by those whose foundation is built on Christ.

Week of Lent 3: Change of Circumstances We move from elementary to middle school, or from our hometown to a new community. We lose a job, or gain a child, or accomplish a goal, or relinquish a dream. Through it all, we learn to give thanks to God in all circumstances.

Week of Lent 4: Change of Heart Jesus' words to the Pharisees give us pause: "You honor me with your lips, but your hearts are far from me." Jesus invites us to experience a change of heart that will in fact change every part of our lives.

Week of Lent 5: Change of Plans God's ways are not our own. We expect a conquering king and hero, but Jesus inste down the road to Jerusalem and humbles himself on the cross. God changes our plans and replaces them deeper than anything we could imagine.



Lent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.

The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in *The Reason for God:* "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."
