### **LEGALISM 101: PUT AWAY LOVELESS DEMANDS**

"God is love," the Bible says (1 John 4:16). Everything he is and does emanates From love. Even God's desire that we follow his law flows from love. Legalism, however, it never flows from love. Legalism sets forth laws and expectations without a hint of love in sight. Jesus pointed out this problem as he evaluated the teachers of the law and the Pharisees of his day. They explained to others in detail the laws and commands of Moses, but they didn't obey God in their own lives. They laid unreasonable burdens on others while they themselves were unwilling to help these poor people carry their burdens.

One of the hallmarks of legalism is placing expectations on others without a Spirit of loving empathy, detaching ourselves from how those laws are making others feel. If we are unwilling to live by rules we proclaim, not only do we lose credibility but we also show a callous attitude toward those who are struggling to keep them. We must ask ourselves, "Are we willing to walk the walk or only talk the talk?" Indeed, we must ask, "Are we even able to walk the walk we are talking about?"

Jesus did both! He never shied away from proclaiming God's law in all its truth. But along with that, he took his place alongside every sinner, walking the walk of holy obedience. More than that, he invited them to come to him to be unburdened and find peace in his obedience in our place. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). When a woman caught in adultery was about to be stoned, Jesus said to her accusers, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first" (John 8:7,9).

Putting away legalism means compassion, not just commanding. It means Releasing from guilt, not addon on more layers of guilt. All of this can only flow from love for the sinner, as Jesus has loved us.

Dear Savior, you lifted the burden of sin from us and love us perfectly. With that same spirit of empathy and love, may we reach out to others with your love and forgiveness. Amen.
