NORDIC CHURCH PROJECT (NCP) UPDATE #2

In late February the application for the NCP planning grant was completed and submitted by George Sincock and Pastor Mary Lou. This grant offers a 2:1 payout for the purpose of planning future projects, maintenance or otherwise, and tops out at \$5,000. This means that if we raise \$2500, we can be eligible for the full \$5000 from NCP. This money can be used then to hire an engineer or architect to provide us with a 25year maintenance plan as well as offering suggestions for installing the new stained-glass windows using historical preservation techniques. Bill Nusbaum is getting names of qualified professionals that we can contact for this maintenance plan. Bill's son is offering us his expertise in finding an engineer or architect - Thank you, Bill Jr.!

Two construction companies were contacted by George Sincock and Gene LaPlante for the purpose of estimates of upcoming projects like the installation of the windows. Both



companies have been onsite and we're waiting for the estimates. None have been received to date. In mid-March, George Sincock and Pastor Mary Lou were interviewed by a reporter from the Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel who received our name from the NCP director. The reporter is interested in doing an article on churches involved with the NCP. At the end of the 45-minute interview, the reporter was interested in coming up in June for our annual Fish Boil and to talk more about our church and ongoing ministries and projects. George even offered to pay for her and her cameraman's tickets to the boil – it's in print now so it's a commitment! Thank you, George!


