

Parking Lot Services for April and May

April parking lot services are April 1st, 2nd, 4th and 25th. May parking lot services will be May 23rd and May 30th. Below are a few of the amended guidelines for the parking lot services. The entire document was emailed the weekend of March 28th.

Guidelines when attending Parking Lot Worship service

Please arrive no earlier than 15-20 minutes before the service begins. **The entire parking lot can be used if you keep vehicles spaced 6-10 feet apart.** The church building will be open for staff and volunteers needed to create the service only. The upstairs bathroom is for true emergencies. There will be an attendant parked in front of the door to assist with any emergencies. We are planning for the service to be around 30 minutes. If you **MUST** exit your vehicle, please wear a mask so as to prevent the spread of the coronavirus.



Who can be in your vehicle For your safety, it is recommended only one household per vehicle; members of differing households should not be in the same vehicle. **If you are parked over 6 feet from the car next to you and wish to greet them, you may do so through an open window if both parties agree. You are encouraged to continue to use your mask and remain in your car.**

Entering the parking lot

The south entrance will be used for entering and exiting the parking lot as the north entrance will be closed. Pastor Trent will be greeting everyone from the front steps by the bell tower. **If you wish to speak to Pastor, either on your way in or out, stay to that side of the driveway so others may pass you. You may have your window down at this time; having your mask on is recommended.** Please note that during the service Pastor Trent will be inside the church in the sanctuary so he will not be seen.



SUNRISE SURPRISE

The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center — just like Jesus' empty tomb!
