One Sunday morning years ago, a man came out of church, shook the minister's hand, and commented on the sermon. "Thank you, Pastor, for that wonderful message," he said. "My wife needed to hear every word of it." Thankfully, he was kidding! But I suspect that there are times when we are tempted to forget that words of warning also apply to us: "That was a fine message. I sure hope so-and-so was paying attention." "I wish such-and-such had been able to hear what was said." "I'm so glad the pastor finally brought up those sins today."

We all fall into that trap. We want to apply God's Word to everybody else before we apply it to ourselves.

The Pharisees seemed like such good people. They gave generously to the church. They did good things in the community. They lived self-controlled, out-wardly righteous lives. They said all the right things. But their hearts were lost in the darkness of sin. That's why Jesus told the parable of the two sons. The second son in Jesus' parable was so nice to his father. He offered a cheerful response to his father's request to go and work in his vineyard. "I'll go, sir!" he said. But then he didn't go.

"Which of the two did what his father wanted?" Jesus asked. The answer was clear. True obedience isn't just mouthing the right words. It's not just saying whatever you think somebody wants to hear. It's doing the right things. Without repentance and faith, talk is cheap.

Take Jesus' words to heart. Your time in worship is not a time to thnk about how everybody else should be doing better. It's not a time to be critical of your husband or your wife. No, it's a time to examine your own life and confess your own sins. It's a time to meditate on Christ's death and rededicate yourself to living for him. And then—even if at one point in your life you said no to the Lord—say yes to his will in a spirit of repentance and joy in his gracious forgiveness.

Lord Jesus, teach me humility so that my heart always yearns for the forgiveness you earned for me. Amen

#### REPORT FROM COUNCIL MEMBERS: Pastor Report: (Pastor Mary Lou Plummer)

The beginning of December the church office received this email in the office inbox. I just wanted to pass it on to you as a congregation. You need to know that we together are making a difference in the world around us.

Hello,

A few weeks ago I found myself looking for an ELCA church in the area. It was 8:30 and somehow I found your church. It would take about 25min to get there, but I got the toddler ready and told my partner to get out of the deer stand, we were headed to church. He thought I was crazy but he obliged. I know there's no better way to feel God's presence than in His creation, but I was drawn to your congregation. You see, we were visiting my in-laws and within 24 hours of each other my grandmother had a heart attack and my partner's grandmother had a stroke. I needed something, so we hastily got ready and headed to the service. We arrived a few minutes late and it was very clear we had not worshipped with you before, we had no idea where the door even was! You all met us with such kindness and hospitality, it was just what we needed. Our home congregation has little busy bags and when we sat down, our two year old kept asking (very loudly) for "my other toys." I was a little annoyed he wasn't being grateful of the trucks and animals I had put together, and was worried he would soon break out in hysterics. Just what we needed, to show up late through the front door with a screaming toddler.. Luckily, someone brought us one of your bags and he was content.

The pastor who was preaching that day then referenced his daughters who lived in the Minneapolis/St Paul area. We live in that area and call that area home so I knew we were in the right place.

At the end of the service, we were given a wonderful loaf of chocolate chip banana bread and invited downstairs for fellowship. It was a very welcome invitation I wish I could have accepted. God led us to your congregation and it was exactly what we needed that day.

My grandmother has since recovered and made it home, while my partner's grandmother has passed away. I hope to be able to visit you guys again. It was so incredibly wonderful to feel so welcome. I'm not sure what else I expected from a group of Lutherans in Wisconsin, but it felt just like home. I think the only thing missing was a Christmas Lefse sale in the bulletin.


